

LibKey Nomad- NMIT Library Guide

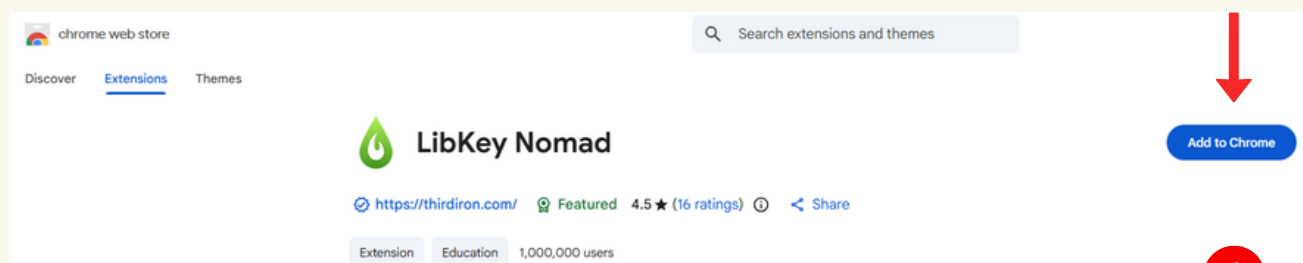
When you search the open web for academic resources, you usually do not have access to the full text of articles on journal websites, Google Scholar, PubMed, and similar platforms. Libkey Nomad is a browser extension that you can add to your browser of choice to redirect you from paywalled articles to their full text available in the NMIT library collections. It provides direct access to full-text articles from the website that you visit.

Libkey Nomad is compatible with most major web browsers, namely Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, Microsoft Edge, Apple Safari, Brave and Vivaldi.

Installation

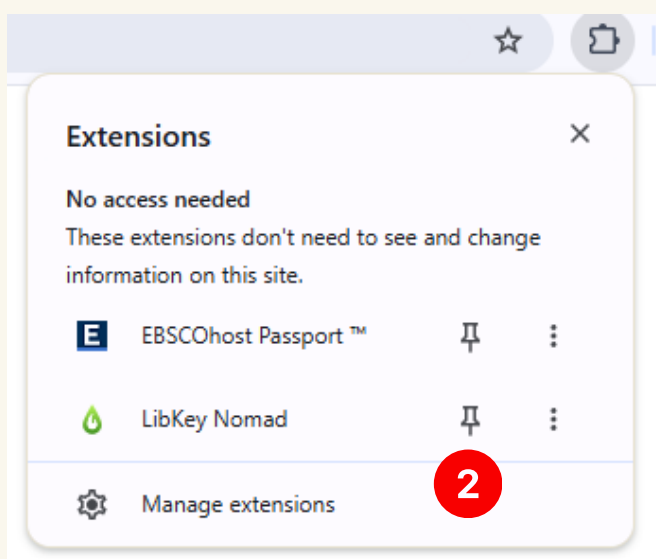
Download the extension: Visit the official [LibKey Nomad Download Page](https://thirdiron.com/) and select your preferred browser. You can also search directly in your browser's webstore for LibKey Nomad.

Add to the browser: Click the Add or Install button in your browser's extension store.

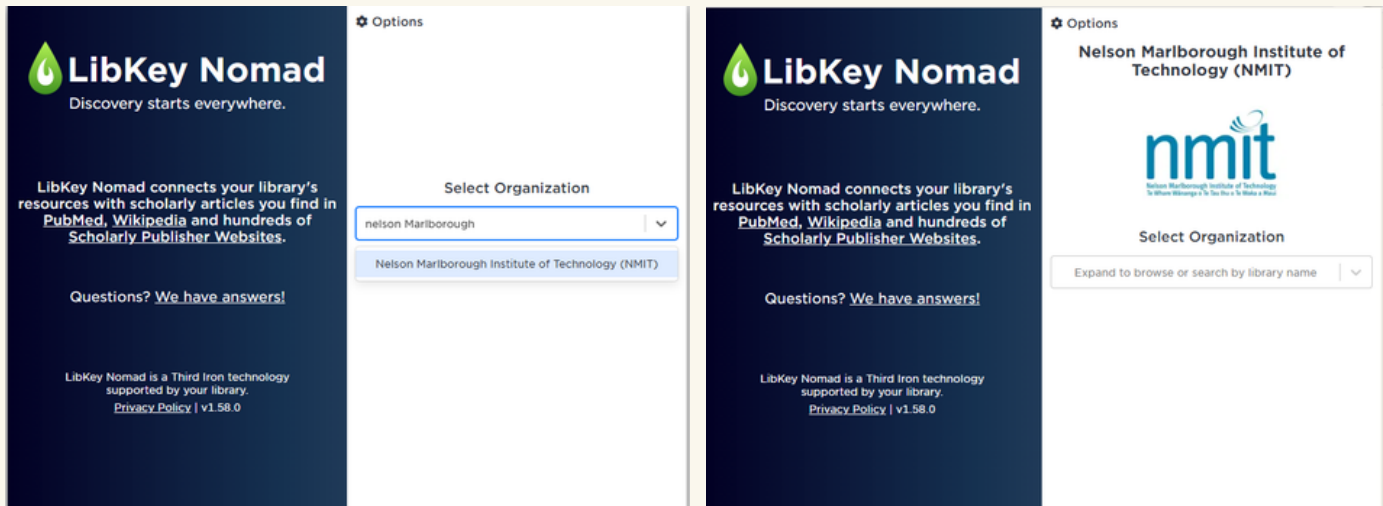


(1) Check the extensions folder (usually the puzzle piece icon at the top right of your browser screen) and ensure that the LibKey Nomad Extension is installed.

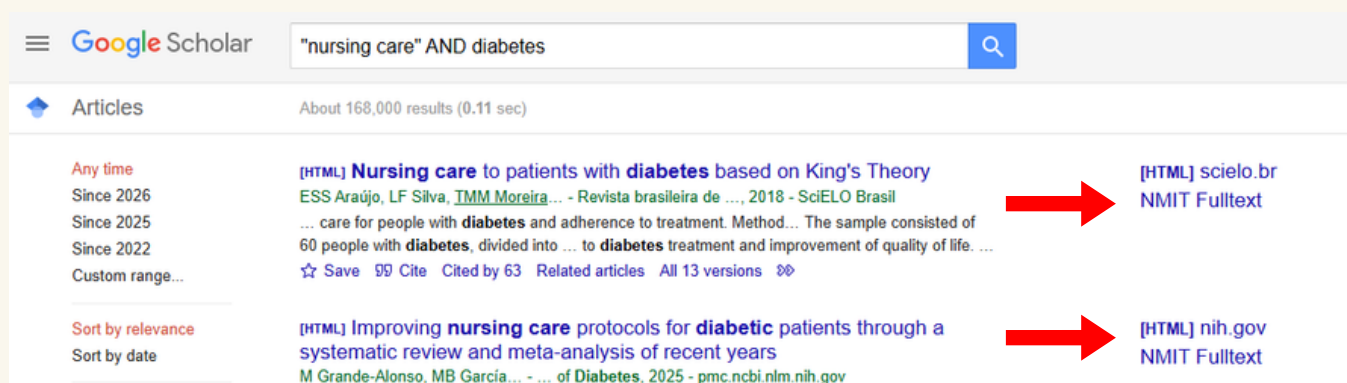
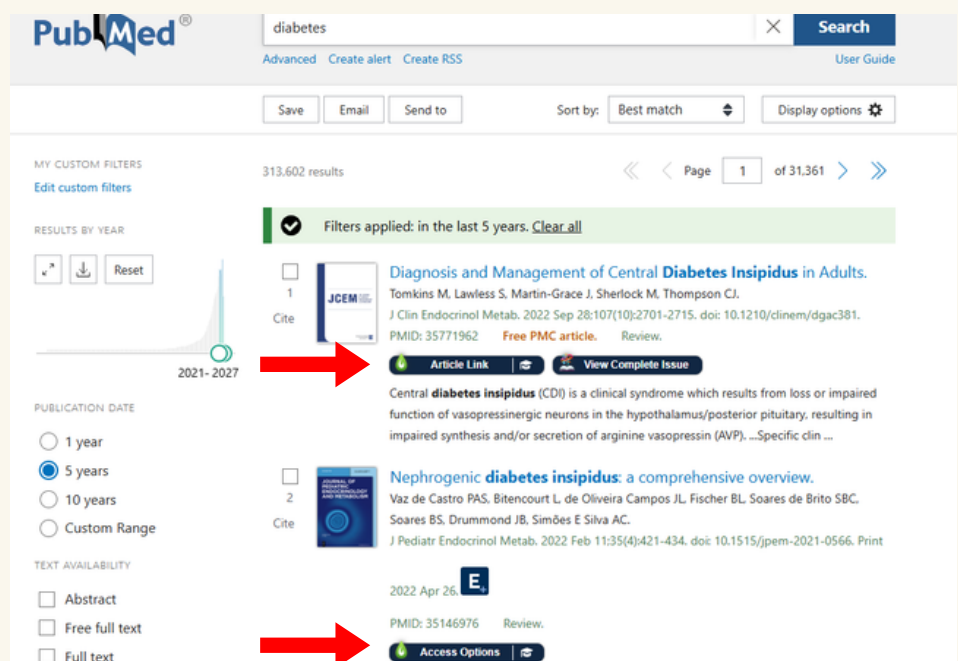
(2) For easy access, you can pin this extension by clicking the pin button next to its name.



Select Your Institution: Once installed, a window will appear asking you to select your institution. Search for **Nelson Marlborough Institute of Technology** and select it from the drop-down list.



When you are browsing websites that mention a scholarly article (like search results on Google Scholar or PubMed or a list of references on Wikipedia), look for the 'LibKey Nomad' or 'NMIT full text' button.



On most journal websites, you have to open the articles to see the LibKey Nomad link.



When LibKey Nomad does not find full-text, it will direct you to other options, such as an interlibrary loan. The 'Download PDF' text appears in the LibKey Nomad icon when the full text is available in the NMIT library collection. The meanings of other buttons are explained below.

 Download PDF Your library has this item and we can instantly download the PDF Full Text in one click.	 Article Link Your library has this item and we can link you directly to the article page, where you can access the full text.
 Manuscript PDF An Open Access version of the article is available. This may not be the final, published version of the article.	 Manuscript Link
 Access Options The article may not be immediately available but your library can help you get it.	 View Complete Issue A link to the BrowZine platform where you can view the full journal issue in which the article is published, allowing you to find additional, relevant articles.
